






As part of International Women's Day, Bunny Class have been discussing who children are inspired by and why, by sharing great ideas.

The Springs Easter Project leads pupils through a series o workshops that help them engage with the Easter story.

Children will learn and create movement in response to the story. There is opportunity for spiritual development and the children will us their imaginations and creativity, growing empathy, self knowledge, em and self-confidence. aii-a
