
Our Pupil Values Ambassador this week is Emmanuella. You have been an amazing ambassador for music this week, and we are very proud of you.

Nurturing Faith - Can You Help?

One of the great things about a faith school is that it provides a fantastic opportunity to nurture children's faith outside the home. But how is this done?

Partly it's through the curriculum - for example by having RE right there in the centre. But a faith school also offers opportunities to reflect about spirituality and Christian values through other subjects in the timetable. For example, when you learn about the regularity of maths, you can also reflect on the reliability of God who created a universe in which maths is possible.

When you learn about the ups and downs of history, you can reflect on the justice that God requires and that he has created us all with a thirst for.

Partly we can nurture faith through para-curricular or extra-curricular activities - outings, projects, issues arising out of class time that may not be devoted to a single subject, assemblies, or after school clubs, or how we as a school respond to significant events, whether in our own community or the wider world.

Partly it's about giving children opportunities to expand their faith beyond the walls of the school - for example, through holiday clubs at church, or the Y6 Leavers' Bibles, or other things like that.

Southwark Diocesan Board of Education like all church schools to include a "Faith Group" - sometimes known as a "Christian Distinctiveness Group." It's a working action group comprised of Governors, Parents, Staff, and people from the wider community, whose job is to monitor how Christian faith is being nurtured in the school. Its work could include listening to staff members so we can feed back to Governors and the Diocesan Board about how the school is doing as a faith-nurturing environment. Its work could also include starting a new initiative to nurture children's faith.

YOU can join this group whether you are a practising Christian, someone of a different faith, or someone of no strong faith at all. As long as you will help further the aim of nurturing Christian Faith. If you would like to join the group, please give your details to the school office, and I will be in touch with you.






