May I take this opportunity to welcome you all back to Spring 2. I hope you and your loved ones had a restful and enjoyable half-term holiday

We are ready for the return to school of all our children on Monday 8th March. Click on these links to read our latest <u>risk assessment</u> and <u>'Frequently Asked Questions' guide</u>. Here are the key things for you to remember:

- Please remember to wear a face mask or visor when entering the school, unless you are exempt.
- Please ensure only one member of your household brings your child(ren) to, and collects them from, school each day. This can be a different person in the afternoon to the morning.
- We will be operating a one-way system Pedestrian Gate 1 is our entrance and Pedestrian Gate 2 is our exit.
- ✓ Please drop your child off with us at the hand sanitising stations and then make your way straight to the exit and off the premises. Your child's class teacher and teaching and learning assistant will be in the playground waiting for your child, to greet them and help them line up.
- If you have a child(ren) in other year groups, you may take a seat around the edge of the playground and wait until their classes line up.

- We expect your child(ren) to attend school from 8th March onwards attendance at school is compulsory from this date onwards.
- Please do not enter the school building, unless you have made a prior appointment with the school office.
 We are happy to help you over the phone or via email. This is to protect our office staff, and you and your family.
- If your child presents with symptoms of Covid-19 (a new persistent cough, loss of taste or smell or a high temperature) while at school, we will take the child to our first aid room and a member of our staff will care for them. We will call you immediately and expect you to be with us within 45 minutes of the call. You should then get your child tested as soon as possible and keep them isolated at home for 10 days.
- ✓ Please ensure your child arrives to school on 8th March in the correct school uniform. You can find our school uniform policy by clicking here: School Uniform Policy Please ensure your child's shoes are plain black, with no colourful logos or branding.

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Breakfast and After School Care

Breakfast Club and After School Activity Club will begin on Monday 8th March.

Breakfast Club

- Time: 7.45am 8.45am
 Location: School Hall
- Cost: £4 per day for regular bookings £4.50 for one-off bookings
- Social Distancing: our children will be in Key Stage bubbles: Reception & KS1, Lower Key Stage 2 and Upper Key Stage 2
- The hall will be divided into three sections the bubbles will not mix with one another, and food and activities will be done separately
- Food: the children will be provided a wide range of cereals, toast, porridge and hot breakfast options, as well as fruit juices
- There will be a timetabled selection of games and activities for the children to enjoy once they finish their breakfast
- Please bring your child to the school hall entrance to sign them in every day - please do not drop them at the school gate
- Capacity: maximum of 30 children

After School Activity Club

- Time: 3.00pm 6.00pmLocation: School Hall
- Cost: £8 per day for regular bookings £10 for one-off bookings
- Social Distancing: our children will be in Key Stage bubbles: Reception & KS1, Lower Key Stage 2 and Upper Key Stage 2
- The hall will be divided into three sections the bubbles will not mix with one another, and food and activities will be done separately
- **Food**: the children must bring with them a healthy packed dinner. We will provide the children with healthy snacks and drinks to supplement this.
- There will be a timetabled selection of games and activities for the children to enjoy before and after they finish their dinner.
- Please come to the school hall entrance to collect your child every day.

Recovery and Wellbeing

We know that the return to school for our children will bring with it a range of emotions and feelings. We will take our time, focus on the wellbeing of our community and enjoy being with one another again.

Our staff will provide core learning each morning, as usual. For the first few days we will offer mindfulness, art, PSHE and PE sessions in the afternoons to enable our children to find their feet again after such a long time away.

Once the children are settled back into school life, we will accelerate our provision so that our children can begin to fill in any gaps that may have occurred in their knowledge and understanding.

Our pastoral, welfare and inclusion teams will be on hand to support any child that displays signs of unhappiness or anxiety. We also have a very exciting announcement to make relating to our children's mental health and wellbeing at Holy Trinity. All will be revealed in next week's community update.
