**Dear Holy Trinity Community,** 



Children have exhibited their love for science during a variety of experiments planned and carried out by the members. We were lucky to have a parent joining us with one of our experiments.


Here are some pictures of some of the other learning that has been happening around our wonderful school:

If they are talking with strangers while playing, do they know the risks and how to mitigate these?


















