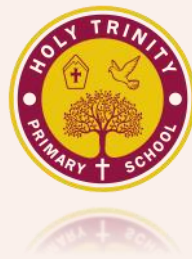

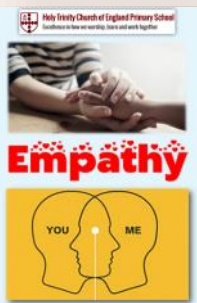
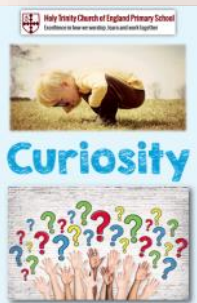
- ✧ Worn 'Odd Socks' to celebrate diversity and equity.

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# Anti Bullying Week 2021

This week, Holy Trinity participated in Anti-bullying week, which was themed 'One Kind Word'.

The week started with children expressing and celebrating their individuality by wearing Odd Socks for Odd Socks Day on Monday.

In PSHE lessons, children celebrated differences and in Literacy, used dialogue and scenes from the movies 'Eleanor's Secret' and 'Wonder' to explore how we can be kind to one another.

Both movies have clear positive messages about choosing kindness and appreciating everyone for who they are.

All classes enjoyed making their kindness boxes and nominating the first kindness ambassadors.

On Thursday, years 5 and 6 participated in ZAP workshops led by the Kidscape team. The workshops explored the differences between teasing and bullying and the role of the bystander and shared skills and techniques that can be confidently used in potential bullying situations.

Godfred in year 6 said, 'The workshop (this morning) was great because there were lots of tips about bullying and if I am bullied, I will be able to deal with it.'

On Saturday morning, football finally returned to Holy Trinity. 10 of our finest Year 5 and 6 footballers ventured to Rosendale Playing fields to take on the mighty Crawford primary. Things looked a little rocky to start off with, as we only had 9 players at the start of the game, however the arrival of Sarone a couple of minutes in soon brought us back up to full strength... and what a start it was!

Holy Trinity started well, and were soon on the attack. An early chance was saved by the opposition keeper, and Crawford attacked back eagerly. Holy Trinity were on the defensive for a while, however Tsana and Jevon made some great tackles and kept them from scoring.

Things didn't look like changing until a break down the centre, and a great strike by Godfred gave Holy Trinity the lead. 1-0, but wouldn't stay this way for long. Soon after, Holy Trinity were on the attack again, but were unfortunately fouled in the box. The penalty was converted by Sarone, and Holy Trinity were 2-0 up. The first half closed with a Crawford goal from a free kick, however we had a 2-1 lead.

After halftime, we were straight back on the attack. Matthew was dominant up front, and quickly made a run down the left hand side, before firing past the keeper. Our lead was increased just a couple of minutes later when Kimari made a fantastic dribbling run, into the opposition box. He would have finished the attack himself, however a lucky tackle in the box by the opposition left the ball open for another goal by Matthew.

He finished his hat trick a few minutes later after some great defensive play by Eddie and D'Andre and a brilliant pass by Khalid. Kimari got his revenge shortly afterwards, when he was rewarded with some fantastic play by getting a goal for himself. 6-1. Jayshaun was an absolute star in goal, making some fantastic stops and lots of catches.

As we headed into the final few minutes of the game, it was clear that the lack of substitutes was having an effect and Holy Trinity were beginning to tire. Crawford kept attacking, and managed to get some lucky free kicks, scoring 3 in quick succession. The game ended shortly afterwards, with Holy Trinity the winners, and the score at 6-4.

Later in the year, the Council intends to promote whole school healthy eating at break and lunch times.

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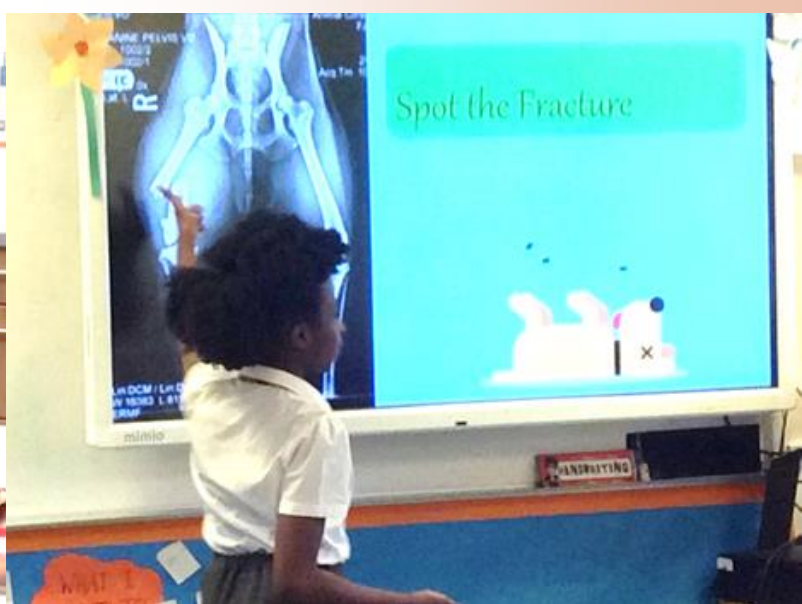
