This week in Collective Worship I finished the story of Zacchaeus.

We've been thinking about it in some detail for most of the term, and learning some new songs.

As we concluded, we thought about cycles of anger and hatred, and how to break them. In the Bible, we are simply introduced to Zacchaeus as a tax collector, working for the Romans and cheating his fellow Jews out of thousands of pounds along the way. But what caused him to act in this way? Was it simply greed?

In my retelling of the story, I imagined that he had been neglected by his parents, left to fend for himself, and was then picked on and bullied by other children at school and in the street. This then led to a cycle of hatred as he decided he'd get revenge when he could.

The only problem with revenge was that it didn't solve the basic problem: he still had no friends and no-one who thought much of him. In fact, everyone hated him, and when Jesus came into town, they did what they could to stop Zacchaeus from seeing him.

Zacchaeus, as we know from the Bible, climbed into a tall tree, and Jesus, passing that way, called up to him. "Come down, Zacchaeus. I must stay at your house today."

For the first time in as long as he could remember, Zacchaeus felt a friendly presence. Someone wanted to be with him. In that moment, the cycle of hatred and anger was broken.

When Jesus arrived at his house, Zacchaeus declared, "Today I give half my wealth to the poor, and if I have cheated anyone I will pay them back four-fold." The result of Jesus breaking the cycle of loneliness and anger was that Zacchaeus did so also.

Our children learn attitudes from us. If they see us as adults harbouring resentment, "not talking" to people, being glad at our enemy's misfortune, that's how they learn to perpetuate their own cycles of anger, resentment, even violence. But if they see us actively befriending those in need, reaching out to those we've fallen out with, forgiving and renewing contact, then they learn to break such negative cycles.

How can you be a model to our children this week?

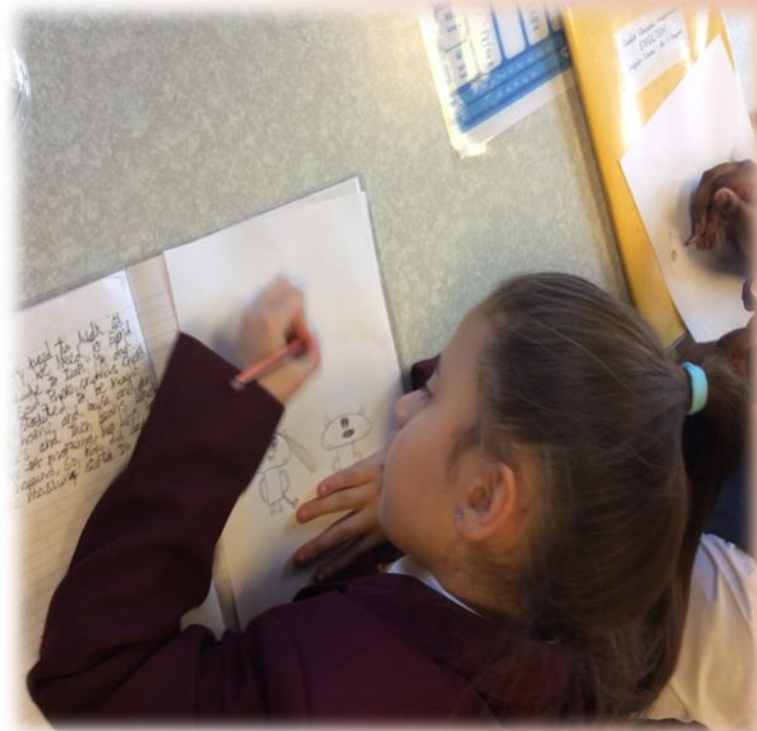
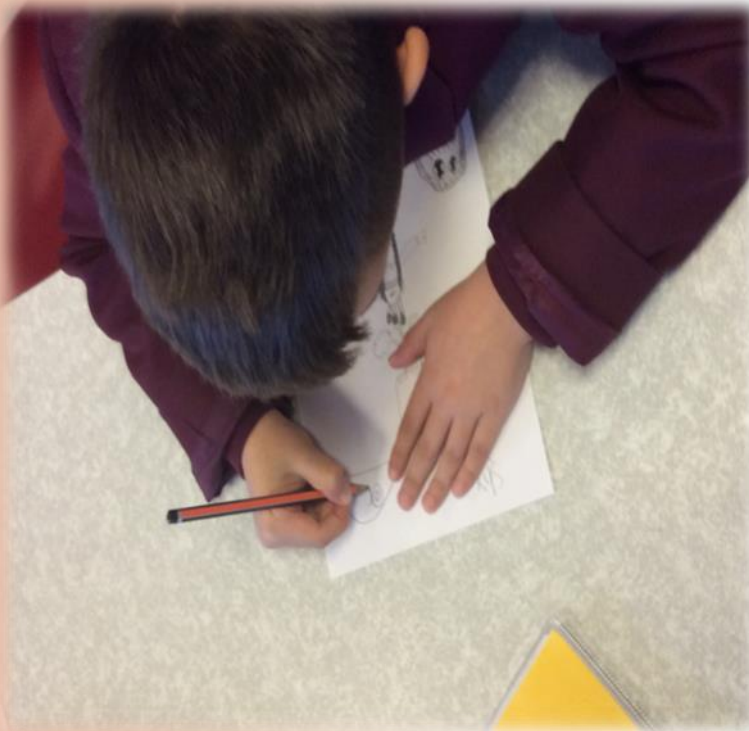
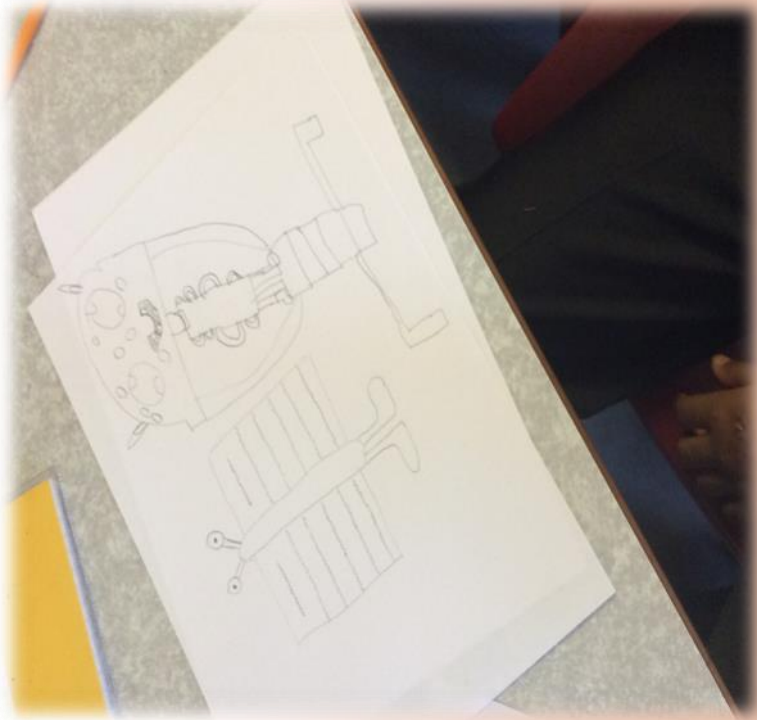
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Unleash your Creative Monster Workshop with National Literacy Trust
