To those of you I have not seen at the front gate yet, I hope you had a lovely half-term holiday and had time to relax and enjoy some quality time together.

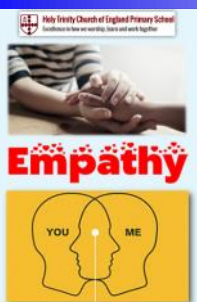
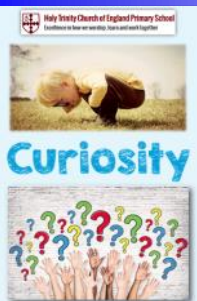

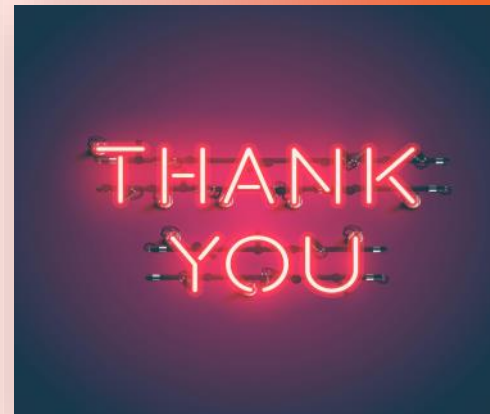


Holy Trinity Values Ambassador
