The War on Video Games

Understanding children's motivations for gaming allows for easier clarity regarding risks, issues and behaviours.

Many people believe the motivation for playing games is just about having a bit of fun and wasting time but whilst that is true for some, for the majority it's much more than that, it's socialisation.

Over the years the media have negatively portrayed games and game-playing, that violent games lead to violence, that many children are addicted and much more. None of this is based on good scientific evidence, it's just great headlines that prey on adult (particularly parental) fears.
