What do you think makes a Christian?

I grew up in a church that had a very clear view of what a "true Christian" was. All you had to do was to say a specific prayer, and that was that.

I remember someone describing some friends, "They're Catholics," she said, "but they are actually Christians as well." It was a genuine revelation (shared only by the "very mature!") that people of other faith styles could actually be Christians also.

Although we believed that - in truth - only the Lord knows the secrets of our hearts, we did have a number of marks by which we could judge if someone had what we considered to be a "genuine faith." Did they have a testimony of how they were converted? Did they sing in church with their eyes shut? Did they tell you they would pray for you? Did they keep a Bible by their bed, or in their living room - and did it look as if they read it? Did they claim Bible promises for their own life? Did they remind you that it was true? Did they speak about the Lord?

These were all ways by which we thought we knew who was a "true Christian." But Jesus never used any of these "marks" to distinguish between people. To think that they are true indicators of someone's faith - or more importantly, that the lack of them shows a lack of true faith - is naïve, foolish and dangerous. Jesus only called for one thing: "Will you follow me and do God's will?"

Of course, none of us ever does God's will completely. But if we're honest, if we are trying to follow Jesus, if we genuinely attempt to do what God wants, then really, that's all that matters.

Jesus makes quite serious demands of his followers, but he is also incredibly inclusive. I pray that we will, like Jesus practice a generous and inclusive faith.








If you are a young person with some experience of playing a musical instrument and would like to play with a band made up of like minded young people, this opportunity is for you.


Youthsayers run weekly, free of charge sessions in Brixton and West Norwood.

The project will offer you a chance to learn about group playing, improvisation, arranging, directing a band and most of all, have fun with music.



Children looking to take their first steps in musical learning are encouraged to join our Musitrax classes. These year-long courses help embed key musical skills and introduce learners to the building blocks of music that shape the world around them.



MUSITRAX SING (5 YEARS OLD)
Songs, games and teamwork encourage musical thinking and doing from the earliest stages.

MUSITRAX TUNE (6 YEARS OLD)

Explore song, rhythm and movement in a year of musical activity.

MUSITRAX PLAY (7 YEARS OLD) Experience drums, recorders and glockenspiels whilst playing as part of a band.

Musitrax courses help children to develop strong musical foundations that act as a springboard to future learning. Children will join the appropriate class for their age group.

PATHWAYS BEGINNERS (AGE 8+/YEAR 3+)

These introductory group courses for beginners allow learners to explore different instruments belonging to their chosen pathway before going on to secure key technical skills on a single instrument.

Learners can explore instruments such as the TRUMPET and TROMBONE on the Brass Pathway, FLUTE and CLARINET in the Woodwind Pathway, DRUMS and TUNED PERCUSSION as part of the Percussion Pathway and VIOLIN and CELLO in the String Pathway.

We also provide pathways for KEYBOARDS, GUITARS and VOICE.


