



All being well, we will begin to return to normality next half term. The data and guidance this week suggests our country is steadily getting there in the fight against Covid-19.







On Tuesday we celebrated Safer Internet Day 2022: 'All fun and games? Exploring respect and relationships online'.






This years theme is Respect and Relationships On-line, with an emphasis on gaming.

carbon footprint.








