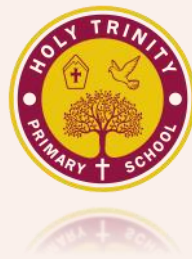

Dear Holy Trinity Community,

This week the Government updated its guidance for school regarding Covid-19 protocols. You can read it here. The majority of restrictions have now been lifted, and here are the headlines:

- ★ Children and staff are no longer required to test twice per week.
- ★ Adults and children continue to be advised to self-isolate for 5 full days, and then test negative twice before returning to school on Day 6.
- ★ Unvaccinated people no longer need to self-isolate if a member of their household or close contact tests positive.
- ★ Schools should continue to practice excellent hygiene and sanitisation, ventilate the site as much as possible and monitor the air quality with our CO2 monitors.

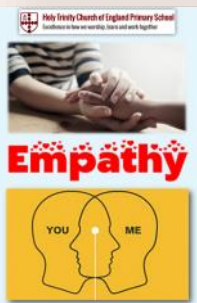
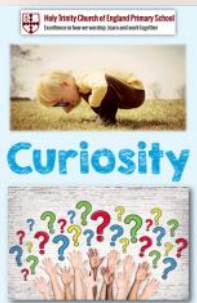

The Springs Easter Project leads pupils through a series of dance workshops that help them engage with the Easter story.

Children will learn and create movement in response to the story. There is opportunity for spiritual development and the children will use their imaginations and creativity, growing empathy, self knowledge, self-esteem and self-confidence.

The workshops can culminate in an informal sharing or performance of the Easter story by the pupils, which can be shown to the school and parents through either a live or filmed presentation.

The project can be anything from one to six days, and can be split into workshops looking at different sections of the Easter story. For example:

- Palm Sunday
- Washing of the feet
- Last supper
- Garden of Gethsemane
- Trial
- Crucifixion
- Rolling away of the stone
- Mary at the Tomb
- Resurrection

The project can be adapted to suit the school.

Many schools choose to use the company one day a week leading up to Easter. Some schools prefer to fit the workshops into an intensive week or another format.
