




**Dear Holy Trinity Community,** 

This week the Government updated its guidance for school regarding Covid-19 protocols. You can read it here. The majority of restrictions have now been lifted, and here are the headlines:

- Children and staff are no longer required to test twice per week.
- Adults and children continue to be advised to self-isolate for 5 full days, and then test negative twice before returning to school on Day 6.
- 水 Unvaccinated people no longer need to self-isolate if a member of their household or close contact tests positive.
- Schools should continue to practice excellent hygiene and sanitisation, ventilate the site as much as possible and monitor the air quality with our CO2 monitors.









