In my assemblies for some of this term we're listening to music.

Listening to music? You mean Christian music?

Not specifically, though our piece this week did happen to be written by a devout Christian - J.S. Bach.

So why is the Vicar leading assemblies where you just listen to music?

Music is part of the amazing way God has made this world. Music has the astonishing power to actually change our mood. Music is put together by humans and performed by humans, but it transports us to another place by acting on our emotions, our imaginations, and our spirits.

When we've listened to our music, we reflect on how it made us feel, or what we were imagining when we listened to it. Then we take what we were thinking about and bring it in to prayer - connecting our reflections with of God's character, and how we might live.

This week we listened to a Bach Partita, played on a mandolin. Bach marked his piece "double presto" - in other words, extremely fast. I think you need a few double espressos to be able to play it! It is an extremely detailed piece of music, and the playing has to be very precise and neat.

Afterwards, we thanked God that he has created all things, even the tiniest atoms - so his work is also extremely precise and neat.

And we asked God to help us in our work to be careful and neat as well.
