I know I write this often, but it has been an incredibly busy and exciting week at Holy Trinity this week. Here are the highlights:

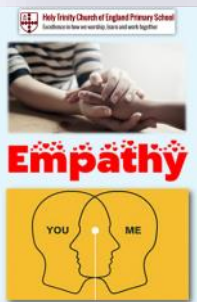
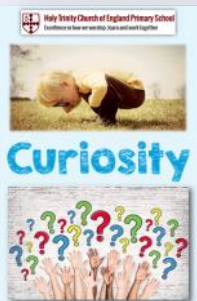
- ★ We were delighted to see our parents and carers at Parents' Evening. Thank you to everyone who attended this week.

Our Pupil Values Ambassador this week is Amaira Rose. You always show such care and kindness to your friends and are always very helpful.

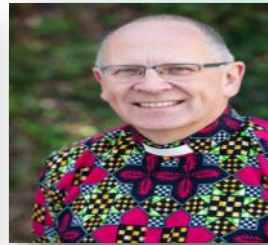
## Holy Trinity Staff Values Ambassador

The Springs Easter Project leads pupils through a series of dance workshops that help them engage with the Easter story.

- Last supper
- Garden of Gethsemane
- Trial
- Crucifixion
- Rolling away of the stone
- Mary at the Tomb
- Resurrection

The project can be adapted to suit the school.

Many schools choose to use the company one day a week leading up to Easter. Some schools prefer to fit the workshops into an intensive week or another format.
