



Dear Holy Trinity Community,



Holy Trinity Values Ambassador








Our Pupil Values Ambassador this week is Ava-Marie.

THE WINDRUSH STORY

Between 1948 and 1971, West Indian migrants travelled to the UK to advance their socio-economic opportunities for themselves and their families remaining in the Caribbean. This group of people, known as The Windrush Generation, responded to an invitation from English officials to begin a month-long journey to England, the 'Motherland'.

Here, they have contributed to the rebuilding of England after World War 2, immensely impacting British culture and shaping the diverse society that we live in today. With many Caribbean migrants settling in Lambeth, it soon became their home and has remained the biggest community for their generation and their descendants.

Windrush Day on the 22nd June is a national commemoration of the first arrival of the 1027 passengers on board the HM Windrush. Windrush Festival 2022 in Lambeth will be a whole community celebration that will serve as a meaningful, educational and joyful tribute to the immense contribution to British life by the Windrush Generation and their descendants.

This year's theme is We Are Here. We Are Here invites us to learn about the history, stories, and experiences of the Windrush generation and their descendants, ensuring their legacy is recognised and celebrated across Lambeth.

Lambeth's Windrush celebrations will acknowledge and amplify the presence of the Windrush generation and their descendants within Lambeth, highlighting the contribution they continue to make to our community.

A proud and joyous reclamation of Black Britishness, We Are Here re-asserts what it means to belong, with Windrush stories taking centre stage in Lambeth's buildings, streets, and landmark institutions.

Whilst many aspects of Caribbean culture have been absorbed into mainstream British society, We Are Here challenges us to dig deeper into the rich and nuanced histories the Windrush generation brought with them, making visible their legacy in Lambeth's cultural fabric and our shared local DNA.





This trip consists in a 2 nights family friendly introduction to camping and appreciation of the British countryside at a beautiful educational farm in the West of England to culminate our Outdoor Learning year.

2. FACILITIES:

- The farm counts with fully accessible toilets (40m from the camping area) and showers (100m from camping area).
- All meals and hot water for tea/coffee will be provided so there is no public access to kitchen facilities.
- There is a small rustic outdoor washing station for wares, with running water. This is located within 50m from tents.
- There will be no laundry facilities available other than toilet sinks in the case you need to quickly rinse something.
- There will be a few spacious covered areas available for workshops in case of persistent rain.
 But remember, in Forest School we are outside in all weather!
- There will be NO ready access to plugs to charge phones (although it's not impossible in an
 emergency, we cannot guarantee you'll be able to charge your phone) so if necessary equip
 yourself with portable charger. The farm has very weak Wi-Fi access and unstable phone
 signal, so it's perfect to disconnect yourself and enjoy the views and activities!

3. WHAT TO BRING:

Clothing

- comfortable clothing for play, run and do other outdoor activities which you won't be worried to ruin/damage (there will be mud, grass, animals, smoke from campfire, etc)
- Shorts and light long trousers (to avoid scratches during hikes).
- Hiking / comfortable shoes for long walks in uneven terrain, avoid open sandals/flip flops, other than for using at the showers.
- Wellington boots are not essential as it will be summer, but you can bring them if you prefer.
 The farm has some used ones in all sizes to borrow if you don't mind.
- Hoodies/jumper, long sleeves, as it might get chilly in the evenings.
- Onesies can be useful over sleeping clothing to keep you warm during the night and extra sleeping socks might be helpful too.
- windbreaker jacket, light raincoat
- Sunhat

Note: you can calculate 1 change per day, so 2 changes plus travelling clothing per person.

loiletries

- Bring your towel (microfibre towels are very practical to travel light and for quick drying)
- Soap in leak-proof container or liquid soap.
- Toothpaste and toothbrush
- Any medication you might need
- Sunscreen/ mosquito repellent if needed

Other items:

- Bring 1 bowl, 1 spoon/fork/spork, 1 cup suitable for hot drinks, 1 bottle for drinking water and refilling per person.
- · torch to walk to toilets during night and batteries if needed for it (there's no access to shops)
- Extra healthy snacks your family will like to have
- Meals will be vegan/vegetarian so, if you absolutely need it, bring any dietary complements, but remember: no cooking is allowed inside tents and we won't be cooking meat on general firesite.
- Small and light foldable rucksack or bag to carry water bottle and essentials during hikes and when going to showers.

Extras (not essential):

- Extra blanket if you think you might need it on top of your sleeping bag (provided) or around the fire in the evenings.
- Extra mat if you'd like to isolate your bag or sleeping mat (provided) from the floor of the tent.

WHAT NOT TO BRING:

We want this to be a memorable outdoor experience for everyone, connect with nature and with each other in a non competitive way, so please leave the following items home:

- No toys please (other than perhaps a needed teddy bear for sleeping), this includes sports
 equipment like balls, bats, dolls, board games, etc
- No electronic devices (including video games, play phones, tablets etc) We do understand, though, parents might want to take pictures/videos.
- No valuable items (although the farm is a very safe environment there will be no lockers and it
 won't be allowed to lock up your tent). No staff from Forest School, Windmill Cluster of Schools
 or Farm will be responsible for any lost or damage of valuable property.

Audition Workshops for ROH Youth Opera

Audition Workshops for ROH Youth Opera Programmes 27th and 28th August 2022

The Royal Opera House is delighted to invite children aged 7-13 with a passion for the performing arts to audition for our Youth Opera programmes this August. No experience or knowledge of opera is required, just a love of singing and performing and an enthusiasm to explore and create opera with the ROH.

If you know a young person in state education who may benefit from our programmes, please read the following for more information on our programmes and how to register interest for an audition workshop. ROH Youth Opera Programmes

There are two programmes available for young performers:

ROH Young Voices is a singing programme for 7-8 year olds, developing participants' vocal control, musical literacy and performing skills. As well as performing at concerts and other ROH events, participants receive gain a grounding in the skills required to progress into our older ensemble, the ROH Youth Opera Company. Audition workshops for the ROH Young Voices will be held on Saturday the 27^{th of} August from 11-1pm

ROH Youth Opera Company offers participants an all-round training in the performing arts, covering vocal technique, language coaching, acting and stage craft, musical literacy, and creative processes for developing new work. Auditions for the ROH Youth Opera Company will be held on Saturday the 27^{th of} August from 2-4pm, and Sunday the 28th August from 11-1pm and 2-4pm.

Both groups meet for half day rehearsals on Saturdays during term time at Covent Garden and participate in an online music theory class after school on Wednesdays. A high level of attendance is expected so please bear this in mind when applying to join the programmes. TO REGISTER YOUR INTEREST

To give your child an insight into the ROH Youth Opera programmes we ask that you share with them our 'What is Opera' video workshop. Please note, this video includes some group activities which your child need not complete. Should they be invited to attend an audition workshop, they will need to be familiar with the song explored in this video as this will be explored further in the workshop. Our audition workshops are relaxed, welcoming spaces inviting attendees to explore opera with our YOC Associate Artists. Children may be asked to sing in small groups, but not on their own. Please note that audition places are limited and based on a range of considerations.
