

Dear Holy Trinity Community,








Our Staff Values Ambassador this week is Ms. Laing.

I'm sorry if what I'm going to say seems obvious to you – maybe I'm just a bit thick... but for the past 44 years, I've never really understood why St Paul said that Love "always hopes."

Hoping always seemed to me to be a bit flaky - as in, "I haven't done much work, I 'm not a maths whizz, I think I got most answers wrong, but hey-ho, let's hope for the best!"

Or sometimes hoping seemed to be little more than a warm feeling – like when you're playing a game and you roll the dice. "I'm hoping for a six," you say. But the odds are stacked against you, 6:1! You might feel fuzzy when you say it, but the outcome is pure luck, and you probably won't get it however much you hope.

So when I used to read in the Bible, "Love always hopes" I thought St Paul had gone a bit soft in the head – what has hope got to do with Love.

This week, after 44 years of reading the Bible, I had to come up with an answer for assembly. Somehow, I managed to imagine three scenarios in which being hopeful would actually be loving.

- 1. You choose hope instead of jealousy. Your friend is going to Jamaica for their holiday. You're stuck in Tulse Hill. It would be easy to be jealous and wish they had long delays at the airport. But instead, you can hope they have a really great time and come back full of joy to share. That would be exercising hope as a deliberate act of love.
- 2. You choose hope instead of being grumpy. You have to sit next to someone you don't really like; you have to play in a team with someone who's no good at your sport; you have to work with someone who's not much fun. It's easy to be grumpy in these situations. But instead you can decide to be hopeful maybe this time you'll find a way to get on better; maybe this time you can help them play better; maybe this time you can work as a team. Maybe your attitude can make the difference. That would be exercising hope as a deliberate act of love.
- 3. You share hope to overcome despair. When someone else is really low, then helping them to find hope requires careful listening, sensitive speaking and patient support. These things take commitment and love.

So – apologies if you already knew all this. It all seems fairly obvious to me now, but it took a long time to get there! So after all that waiting: "Here's to Hope!"
