Dear Parents and Carers of Year Six,

I am pleased to inform you that we have secured a free mentoring service for all our Year Six children, in partnership with the Windmill Cluster, provided by an organisation called Knight's Youth Centre. This mentoring service is designed to prepare our children for their transition to secondary school, and their journey from young people to adulthood. Here is a little more detail:

*The service will be provided by locally based Knights Youth Centre (KYC) [www.knightsyouthcentre.org.uk](http://www.knightsyouthcentre.org.uk) who have been doing some great work at Richard Atkins Primary School throughout last year, providing support for Year Six pupils.*

*This mentoring service is specifically working with the Year Six children, focusing on equipping them with the tools for their upcoming transition to secondary school and beyond. At the end of the academic year, the children will be invited to a transition day at the youth centre, to connect children with community support, which would be available after they leave primary school.*

The details of this mentoring service are as follows:

- Every Year Six child will have access to this support programme during this academic year.
- Each group of eight children would complete a nine-week course. Two sessions would be held each week, for two different groups.
- These sessions will be held in the Conference Suite on Thursday afternoons, from 1.40 - 3.15pm.
- We will begin tomorrow, Thursday 22<sup>nd</sup> September, and run every Thursday until the end of the academic year.
- Two youth workers from KYC will be running the mentoring service every Thursday.
