Dear Holy Trinity Community,



Year 2 visited Holy Trinity Church this week as part of their RE learning. We learned so much from the visit. Thank you Reverend Dormandy and Nicole.









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
Learning In Focus

Not only was it a thoroughly enjoyable day, but a lot was learned on how the Docks shaped today's City of London.














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FRITH CORNER



This term in my assemblies we're looking at the story of Jonah, and each week we're learning a new song from a musical I wrote a while back.

Many years ago, in one of my previous churches, I was asked to baptise a child called Jonah. As I had songs from this musical, I thought it would be neat to make the whole service revolve around the Jonah story – how he was scared at first to do what God wanted, but how God found him and gave him the courage to fulfil his mission.

The parents of this baby boy were furious with me! "How dare you bring up all those negative stories about Jonah!" they said. "We want his life to be full of blessings!"
I thought to myself, "Well, you were the ones who named him "Jonah!"
The thing about the Jonah story is that it's all about blessing.

Jonah, like all of us, got scared; Jonah like all of us, disobeyed God; Jonah like all of us could be found by God and recommissioned; Jonah like all of us could renew his call and his courage. And even the wicked people of Nineveh get blessed in the end as well, because they also turn from their ways.

So this is a story of great triumph, even though it has unlikely beginnings.

Courage is an important theme in the story.

All around the world right now people need courage.

People in Russia speaking out against the war need courage. People in Tigray, Ukraine and other war-torn places need courage. People living in areas where climate change has destroyed their livelihood need courage. And people here in the UK need courage too as we face this cost of living crisis, or for any number of other reasons.

Are you in a situation where you need some courage?

God is always wanting to give us courage for all the situations we face.

Here's a prayer you might like to say:

Jesus, you were courageous and did not worry about what those who hated you would do to you. You only met them with love and with courage. You proclaimed that your father was the only one with the final say. Jesus, I ask you to help me develop the same courage that will help me be assertive in my decisions. May I say what I need to say without worrying that I would be judged or punished for it. You are my Lord who conquered it all. Amen.


