Intent

The value of Art and Design at Holy Trinity is to provide children with opportunities to explore and gain an understanding of the world around them in a creative context, making links across the curriculum to deepen understanding of all new learning.

As part of the Holy Trinity Curriculum, learners are encouraged to express themselves when learning about all areas of the curriculum. This personal discovery is developed through using a range of mediums including drawing, painting, sculpture and design.

Finding out about the wider world through exploration of different artists and designers from past and present, means, their understanding of their place in the world and in history becomes more meaningful.

Studying a range of art, gives children the opportunity to explore artworks critically and develop different ways of communication and thought.

The process of art allows children to see beyond the ordinarily observable world and develop their personal growth

The curriculum is designed to incorporate the aims of the National Curriculum for Art and Design and Technology.




Year 4 Topic First lesson using the new scheme of work.
