- ◆ School meal prices: due to a further increase in labour and delivery charges, we have no choice but to increase our school dinner prices to £2.65p per day for children in Years 3 − 6. This price is still comparatively low in relation to nearby schools in the borough.
- Some exciting news! Our ground floor toilet block will be completely renovated over the summer holiday, with attractive and modern fittings, a bright colour scheme and even some new Dyson hand dryers. We are sure this will help our children to feel even more comfortable when using these facilities. This work is set to be completed by the last week of the summer holiday, ready for your return in September.
- As many of you will know, our school received an Ofsted inspection on Tuesday 11th and Wednesday 12th July. Our community stepped up and performed incredibly well during what is undoubtedly a pressurised situation. I am very proud of every single member of our staff team for the way they represented our school.
