We had an amazing start to the day with our children arriving in their national wear, a sight to behold with a sea of beautiful fabrics, styles







The other photo is of the National Windrush Monument in Waterloo Station, unveiled in June 2022.


Floella was Chair of the Windrush Committee that oversaw it's implementation.




