



The Christmas Nativity Play – The Dinky Donkey



This week the children in early years and key stage one presented their Christmas production of the play 'The Dinky Donkey' to a packed audience of parents/carers.















The activities provided the opportunity for all competitors to further develop their team building skills and learn about non-contact participation.
































Our EYFS and KS1 Pupils put on a splendid Christmas Production on Wednesday 13th December 2023 entitled "The Dinky Donkey"




After deduction of all expenses we are happy to announce that we raised a total of £500 for the school




