




SNACKS IN SCHOOL










Youtube and Artificial Intelligence

What Parents & Educators Need to Know about SHOPPING PLATFORMS

WHAT ARE THE RISKS? For people looking to make purchases on their phones, several shopping apps – such as Temu – allow users to buy goods at reduced prices. Others, like Vinted and Depop, let you sell items you no longer want. As internet shopping continues to grow, however, so does the risk of scammers, hackers and breaches of privacy.

MISSING ITEMS

Users of Virited, Depop and Terriu have reported not receiving their products despite payment being taken. Users can initially contact the seller to query a missing item, and they have between two and five days (depending on the app) to tell the company what has bappened, However, once the money has reached the supposed realist it can be outly difficult to get have.

SCAMMERS AND

Scanithers are always on the leakant for unsuspecting buyers or sellers. SLOW REFUNDS

While all apps offer a refund if the product is domaged or doesn't match the description, it contains up to a month to be compensated for this, for many people (especially during a cost of living crisis) that can be a long time to be without both the product you bought and the hard-earned cost you spent on it.

MISLEADING DESCRIPTION

Advice for Parents & Educators

ALWAYS STAY ON THE APP

It's vital that users pay far any goods through the same app on which they feund then, to ensure they are covered by buyer pritection. This means users can occass support if the item unives damaged, junt as described, or describe and or account only at all allowing them to seek compensation for the loss. Such regulations can't protect you, however, if you didn't do the dead through the tags in question.

BE WARY OF PHISHING ATTEMPTS

Scammers frequently send messages within these opps to steel personal and financial information from other users. Don't respond to these messages – and under no Excumptances should you follow one limits they centere. Check for spelling errors, as well as inspecting the name of the sender. Report any suspected phishing emails to the apply a help centre – and notify your bank if you think your financial information has been compromised.

CHECK REVIEWS

Take firms to read the reviews and comments left by other users - not just of products but of selects and buyers, to ensure they be legitance and reliable. KEEP SAFE AS A SELLER






Year 1 had good experience exploring our local green space- Brockwell Park.
